SUMMARY:

To undertake sewing projects that assist the therapy department, the education department, and the clinic as a whole

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES include the following. Other duties and special projects may be assigned.

- Sewing projects for the therapy department such as crash pillows, covers for gym equipment (king size futons), small towels for testing kits
- Sewing projects for the education department such as bibs and towels for snack time
- Sewing projects for the agency as a whole: may entail covering large climbing structures with sewable vinyl
- Help with creative ideas for the agency as a whole that entails sewing

QUALIFICATIONS

To perform this job successfully, an individual must have your own sewing machine, preferably a machine capable of sewing dense fabrics such as Velcro and/or vinyl. The individual should be able to be creative and envision a sewing project without a pre-made pattern. May be necessary to create your own patterns if needed. Individual will need to have transportation to either the Montlake or Magnusen sites for purposes of envisioning a project and/or taking measurements.

Boyer will reimburse the sewing volunteer for materials that the volunteer may purchase.
